


Safety

Assistance

Stewards will be present throughout the site wearing yellow jackets. They can offer advice or call for assistance.

Accessibility

The whole site is accessible by wheelchair with the exception of the insides of the ruined halls. Stewards can assist those with limited mobility in mounting the few steps for access to the ruins.

Lost Children

The Organisers will do all they can to care for lost children, but this does not supersede the responsibility of parents or guardians to look after their own children.

Visitors with young children will be offered a wrist band for each child upon which a mobile phone number can be written.

If a child is apparently lost, a steward will take them to the **Event Control Point** by the **West Entrance Gate**, and a call made to the wrist band mobile phone number. If there is no answer or if there is no wrist band, an announcement will be made over the site PA system.

If a parent or guardian loses a child, they should report to the **Event Control Point**.

First Aid

St John Ambulance will be located next to the **Event Control Point** at the **West Entrance Gate**. In addition there will be first aid trained stewards on duty. Any steward may be approached to call for first aid. In a life-threatening emergency dial 999.

Emergency Evacuation

Should the site have to be evacuated, a PA announcement will be made and visitors should leave the site via one of the two entrance gates or the exit at the south of the site, under the guidance of the stewards, and shown on the Site Map.

Challenge 25

The 'Challenge 25' procedures will be in operation at this event to ensure that alcohol is not sold to those under the legal age for the purchase and consumption of alcohol. If challenged, and you do not have the appropriate identification, you may be refused the purchase of any alcohol and this refusal with be recorded.
