Master and Access recordings and transcripts

Master recordings are archived in WAV and MP3. In a very few cases, Access copies differ in content if a redaction is deemed essential before the recording is made available to the public. The access copy is available to the public but not the master.

A verbatim master transcript is prepared. Where requested by the narrator, we will edit the transcript for public access, as noted in individual files. This may involve omitting repetitious sounds (ums, OK, etc) or duplicated phrases; including additional written or corrected material provided by the narrator; redacting personal data about living persons to conform with GDPR or libel requirements. Omissions are shown by ellipses (...). The narrator's spoken words are transcribed in plain font and anything else (interviewer's words, stage directions, extraneous sounds, additional written material, editorial notes) in italics. The access copy is available to the public but not the master.

Everyone who records for us gives informed written consent before their memories are made public. It is usual in academic oral history research for contributors to be anonymised or given pseudonyms, but our narrators overwhelmingly choose to use their real names in their wish to make an authentic contribution to our community archive, for the benefit of future generations.

Access recordings and transcripts are normally freely available for private study and research purposes. Please note that the material is copyright and should not be reproduced without seeking and gaining the permission of the copyright owner. As a rule, material is copyrighted to one or more of the partner groups but families retain copyright of personal images.

All but a few recordings are available and can be provided in MP3 format (or WAV if necessary). Most have a complete summary and transcript, which will be sent as a PDF file. See each entry for details about what is available.

Description: Francis Mitchell grew up in Fareham and started bell-ringing as a teenager there. This interesting recording starts with memories of his own childhood. We approached Francis as someone who knew Reg Cockle well and could provide a human side to add to Reg's documented history. Through a long friendship, formed through bell-ringing together at St Peter's Church, Bishop's Waltham, Francis was able to recall Second World War stories that Reg had told him. In the second half of the recording, Francis records useful information about the bells of Bishop's Waltham and traditions of bell-ringers in this area. Description: The Cole family lived in the Basingwell Street area. During WW2 Don's father served in the Bishop's Waltham Fire Brigade. At school, Don sheltered under the Mafeking Hero during air raids and slipped off to play football during dogfights. He saw a parachute from a German plane displayed by Lang's outfitters shop. There were concerts for the "Welcome Home Fund". Jean's house in Waltham Chase was nearly hit by a Doodlebug, while her family slept. She recalls a bombed house in Shirrell Heath where a boy died. Don remembers the night his brother-in-law escaped death when a bomb fell on the Army Camp near Mill House.

Description: Jean describes wartime life at Furzecote Farm, Curdridge. Before D-Day, lorries parked along Curdridge Lane, troops camped in The Plantation. She picked strawberries for a cream tea for Churchill and Montgomery when they visited officers there. After the war, Italian Prisoners of War stayed on to work for the Gamblin family of market gardeners. Bruce's father had a market garden business in Shirrell Heath. Bruce helped deliver jerricans of fuel to Hazel Holt. He describes tanks delivered to Shedfield Common. Numbers on a Botley wall record tanks parked along the main road prior to D-Day.

FITALL, Doris

Keywords: 1930s, World War 2, 1940s, 1950s, Swanmore, Fareham, Gosport, childhood, family, home, parents, marriage, education, work, WRNS

Description: The Willoughby family moved to Swanmore in 1929, when Doris, the youngest, was 7 years old. She describes her childhood world in these two recordings. Her father had been recuperating from First World War injuries, but eventually worked in the building trade and built 2 family homes for them, the 2nd in Fareham. Doris remembers Swanmore School in the 1930s and leaving home to become a mother's help for a shopkeeper family in Fareham, then Chichester. At the outbreak of World War 2, Doris was working in her uncle's shop at Kintbury, Berkshire, but returned home to Fareham, meeting her future husband at the baker's shop where she worked. At age 18 she joined the Navy: she describes her life at Gosport in the Blitz and serving as a Steward at Fort Wallington in the run-up to D-Day. For many years Doris played piano or organ at local churches.

HALL, Nicholas

Keywords: Cardiff, Wales, Lockerbie, Scotland, WW2, home, education, work, medical services Description: Mrs Nicholas Hall recounts her childhood in Cardiff and rural Scotland during WWII with a vivid account of nights in air raid shelters and joining her father on his one short home leave in London. (She also describes the anxiety of the family about her mother in Lockerbie at the time of the 1988 air crash.) In 1947 she began her training as a nurse, first in Oxford, then London, before service in Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service in the 1950s when as a young Sister she had to handle drunkenness and homosexuality with discretion.

In her 2nd recording, Nicholas talks about her work as a Queen Alexandra nursing sister at naval air bases. She discusses her life as the wife of a naval officer with postings in the UK and overseas. She also recounts her life in Upper Swanmore between postings and her later move to Bishop's

Key words: Titchfield, childhood, 1940s, Second World War, 1950s, 1960s, 1970s, education, Titchfield School, the Gregg School, USA, tractors, strawberry growing, potatoes, Titchfield Abbey Fruit Farm Description: Farmer's son Jimmy Harris was born at the start of the Second World War and grew up in Titchfield. Run by his father and uncle, the farm had grown strawberries, fruit and vegetables since 1934. The family had moved down from Oxford in the early 20th century. During the War, working mainly by hand, they reduced the strawberry crop and expanded vegetable production on 180 acres of land. After the War the brothers split up and Jimmy worked for his father once he left school in the early 1950s. It was a hard life, even with tractors, but Jimmy won a Churchill Scholarship to study mechanical harvesting in the US in 1976. He eventually set up his own fruit farm at Titchfield, now derelict, but in its day a thriving Pick Your Own operation.

In the end she married at 19 and had a family, before finally triumphing in later life with a history degree at the (now) University of Winchester. In the second interview, Betty recounts working with John Bosworth from the formation of Bishop's Waltham Museum Trust. She was Chair at the time of his death.

He improved education standards in Bishop's Waltham by introducing new horizons for pupils in and beyond the curriculum, for example with primary French and school visits and holidays. John Watts is remembered today for achieving a 20 metre indoor swimming pool which was built mainly by volunteer effort 1976-1979. This remarkable provision, still in daily use today by nearby schools and the local community, remains the only one of 2 indoor pools ever built in Hampshire's primary schools.

In this lively set of 3 recordings, made shortly before her death in December 2021, Jean reveals her other life, as a Scottish MP's daughter, a naval wife in her husband's early overseas postings and as a titled diplomat's wife when her husband was Marshal of the Diplomatic Corps at St James' Palace in the 1990s. The first recording recounts memories of her early life up to her marriage to James Weatherall, an ambitious young naval officer with an eye for a pretty woman. In the 2nd recording, Jean's everyday life as a Naval wife up to the Falklands War is described. For the first few years after their marriage in 1962, Jean followed Jim in his naval postings, clearly relishing worldwide experiences along the route. She then settled down in Ashton, to bring up her family, a single parent whenever Jim was away at sea. Jean describes some of the difficulties she faced with her characteristic humour and realism. In the third recording, Jean recounts her extraordinary life after the Falklands War, forever unassuming and looking to support those she meets. After repelling an Argentinian Exocet attack, Jim's triumphant career took him from Captain of Ark Royal V, to Belgium with NATO and to Norfolk, Virginia as Deputy Supreme Allied Commander, Atlantic. Retiring from the Navy, the family moved into the Clock Tower of St James' Palace where, as the Honourable Lady Weatherall, Jean welcomed and taught English to Ambassadors' wives from around the globe as right-hand woman of the Marshal of the Diplomatic Corps, Vice-Admiral Sir James Weatherall.

Retiring in 2000, he started a Health and Safety training company. Knowing the poor response times for ambulances to rural casualities, in 2001 he introduced Heartstart resuscitation training in Bishop's Waltham for local residents, and First Responders, a volunteer group which bridges the gap until emergency services arrive. Today it trains volunteers to a sophisticated level to respond to medical emergencies. He has been active in St Peter's Church since the 1970s and started the community Men's Breakfast - now with 70 members

Description: A memorable account of a Meonstoke childhood. Jean started school there and remembers the King's death and Queen's Coronation in 1953 and the wonderful celebration at the time. Moving to Droxford School at 8, and Cowplain Girls at 11, she was overwhelmed by the size and number of children at each school. Jean's father was a Londoner with an older family and strict discipline, who held down a job as a toolmaker at Briggs/Fords until his retirement. Jean enjoyed a "brilliant childhood", free to roam with friends from the green where she lived. Like her contemporaries, she had no option but to leave school at 15. Jean worked a 12 hour day briefly at Woolworths, then landed a job — and lift to work - at the Post Office in West Meon. After marriage, she lost her job once she became pregnant.
